Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world.

But the good news is that skin cancer is largely preventable by minimising overexposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation.

That's where a Cancer Council UV Meter can help.

What is a UV Meter?

A Cancer Council UV Meter can help schools, early learning centres, workplaces and local governments protect their staff and community by displaying real-time UV strength and prompting people to be SunSmart when sun protection is required.

Cancer Council's UV Meters are designed with their own UV sensor to display the World Health Organization's UV Index, a numerical scale which shows the UV level and associated skin damage risk.














Why UV?

Many people believe that we only need to worry about UV radiation when it is hot, however the reality is that even in cool weather we are all susceptible to the dangerous effects of UV overexposure when the UV is 3 or above.

The UV meter can assist businesses and organisations with duty of care requirements around UV protection.
